

How can I access data?

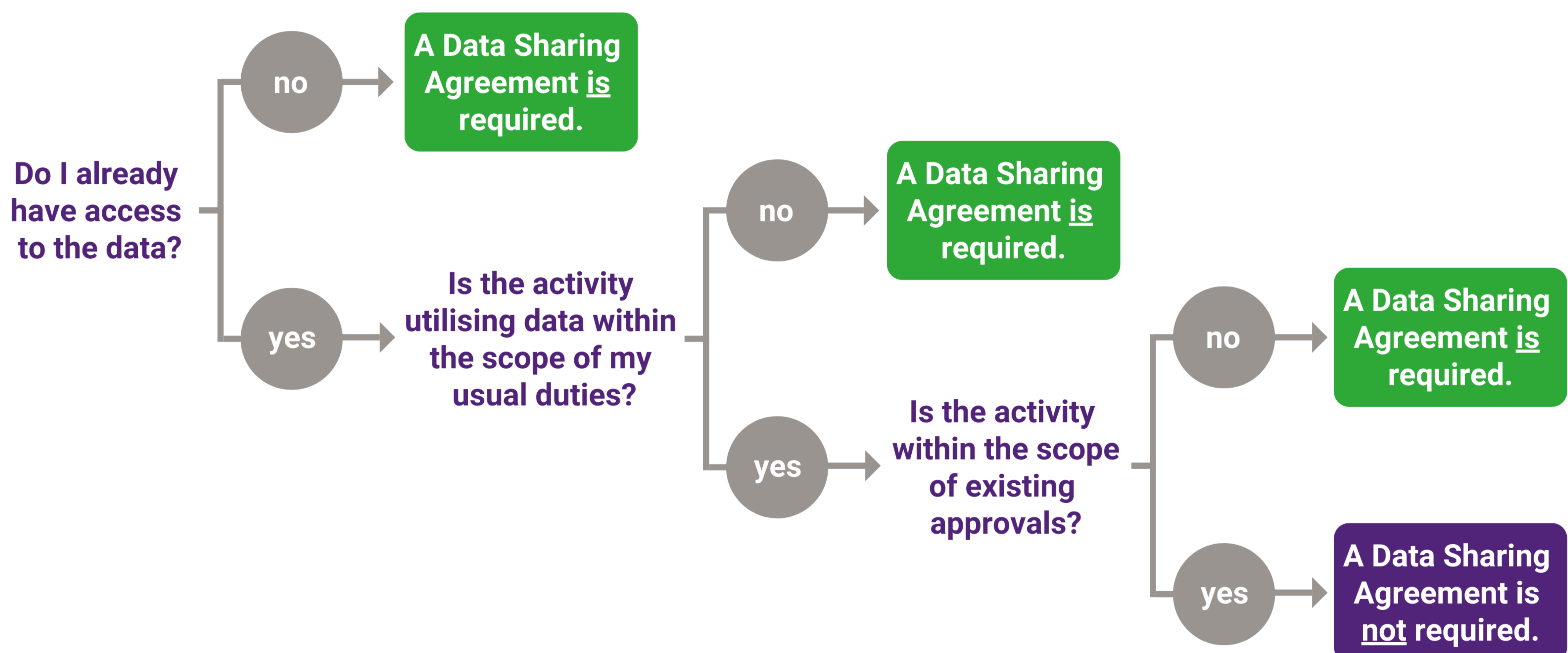
As part of your work, you may need to request access to additional data through a Data Sharing Agreement (DSA).

A DSA is a process to streamline requests for corporate data such as information regarding learning, teaching, and administration. It is filed by Information Consumers and reviewed by

Information Stewards (inducted individuals who are responsible for information within a given entity).

DSAs cannot be used for research data

- For research data, access depends on a variety of factors, including the stage of the project, funder and IP agreements, and publication status.
- To access data regarding ongoing projects, contact the lead investigator.
- To find out how to access published research datasets, visit the [Data at UQ website](#).

How are data sharing agreements completed?

A DSA is completed using one of the two available forms:

- **Analytics:** This form is required when using data for analytics (e.g., for improving systems and services, and ad-hoc reporting requests).
- **Integration:** This form is required when existing data needs to be integrated into another system.
